



and the children involved in the book, including the police. The group voted to rate the book a 3.





Hello Beautiful Ann Napolitano





Cold Mountain Charles Frazier



Water for Elephants Sara Greun



Ozark Bookies


Bright Lights Big Christmas Mary Kay Andrews


The Teacher of Warsaw Mario Escobar

The Woman in Cabin 10 Ruth Ware


This book is a thriller murder mystery that takes place at sea. We rated it a 2.8 out of 5. We felt that it had too many characters and they weren't well developed.




Boozy Bookworms


One Thousand White Women Jim Fergus


